As a volunteer, a consultant, a spokesperson for people living with HIV, a member of advisory groups for hospitals and pharmaceutical companies, as well as workshop leader and TEDx speaker, Denise is passionate about women's health.


Leaving No One Behind", the Canada Pavilion shared Canadian best practices, effective interventions and achievements to address HIV and other STBBI, as well as showcased community innovation and the community-based response to HIV and other STBBI in Canada. Funding for the Canada Pavilion was provided by the Public Health Agency of Canada.

Denise's participation in the Canada Pavilion at AIDS 2024 reignited her hope for increased collaborations across Canada. Denise notes the feeling of inclusivity at the Canada Pavilion was strong, and that the learning opportunities through live presentations both involved and strengthened community ties.

"The presentations were a terrific way for Canada to highlight what we can do and are doing in the HIV response," she says. "Having live sessions instead of pre-recorded videos made for a strong sense of community."

The Canada Pavilion was located in the centre of the Exhibit Hall, immediately following the major sponsors of the conference, and adjacent to the business networking zone. Denise describes that being in the centre of the room, among the key sponsors, left visitors with an impression that Canada cares about HIV
